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Esoscheletro



Size

One size. About 110 cm circumference, 35 cm wide

Level

Easy

Yarn

Borgo de'Pazzi, Kuki, 50gr/110m, 65% wool, 20% ramie, 15% hemp, 3 balls

Hook

6 mm (J)

Gauge

Circumference in pattern stitch 31 cm, 10 cm wide.

Pattern stitch

Start: (ch 7, 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook, 1 PS in sc just made) 4 times.

1-8 rnd: * ch 6 (1 sc, 1 PS) in next sc *; repeat from * to * 4 times, without twisting the chain, sl st in first ch st to join.

Description

Esoscheletro is worked in the round, top-down, from the neck to the shoulders. It's made of long chain arcs and puff stitches.

If you prefer, you can repeat the second round 12 times, to make it longer, cozier and warmer.

Notes

US crochet terminology is used in this pattern. For UK readers: US single crochet = double crochet, US double crochet = treble crochet.

Stitches, techniques, abbreviations

Chain stitch (ch); puff stitch (PS): pull the loop on your hook until it is about 2 cm long, yarn over, insert hook in indicated st, yarn over, draw the yarn through the stitch and pull up a long loop, (yarn over, insert the hook in the same stitch, yarn over, draw the yarn through the stitch, yarn over and pull up a long loop) 2 times, yarn over one last time and pull through all the loops on your hook, ch 1; single crochet (sc); slip stitch (sl st).

Instructions

1 rnd: * ch 8, 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook, 1 PS in sc just made *; rep from * to * 6 times. Without twisting the chain, sl st in first ch st to join.

2 rnd: ch 1, sc in same ch, *ch 6, [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc *; repeat from * to * 6 times; sl st in first sc to join.

3-6 rnd: ch 1, sc in same sc, * ch 7, [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc *; repeat from * to * 6 times; sl st in first sc to join.

7-8 rnd: ch 1, sc in same sc, * ch 8, [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc *; repeat from * to * 6 times; sl st in first sc to join.

9 rnd: ch 1, sc in same sc, ch 8 [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc *, ch 9 [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc *; repeat from * to * 4 times, ch 8 [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc; sl st in first sc to join.

10 rnd: ch 1, sc in same sc, ch 9 [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc *, ch 10 [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc *; repeat from * to * 4 times, ch 9 [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc; sl st in first sc to join.

11 rnd: ch 1, sc in same sc, ch 10 [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc *, ch 11 [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc *; repeat from * to * 4 times, ch 10 [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc; sl st in first sc to join.

12 rnd: ch 1, sc in same sc, ch 11 [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc *, ch 12 [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc *; repeat from * to * 4 times, ch 11 [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc; sl st in first sc to join.

13 rnd: ch 1, sc in same sc, ch 12 [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc *, ch 13 [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc *; repeat from * to * 4 times, ch 12 [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc; sl st in first sc to join.

14 rnd: ch 1, sc in same sc, ch 13 [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc *, ch 14 [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc *; repeat from * to * 4 times, ch 13 [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc; sl st in first sc to join.

15 rnd: ch 1, sc in same sc, ch 13 [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc *, ch 15 [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc *; repeat from * to * 4 times, ch 13 [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc; sl st in first sc to join.

16 rnd: ch 1, sc in same sc, ch 13 [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc *, ch 16 [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc *; repeat from * to * 4 times, ch 13 [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc; sl st in first sc to join.

17 rnd: ch 1, sc in same sc, ch 6, 1 sc around ch arcs from rnds 14-16, ch 6, [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc *, ch 17 [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc *; repeat from * to * 4 times, ch 6, 1 sc around ch arcs from rnds 14-16, ch 6, [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc; sl st in first sc to join, ch 1, sc in same sc.

Turn the work of 180° (you will be facing now the wrong side of your project). In the next rnds you will keep on working in the round, but you will be going in the opposite direction. This way, your project will make a slight curve.

18 rnd: 1 PS in same sc, sc in next sc (ch 6, 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook, 1 PS in sc just made) 2 times, * ch 18, 1 PS in last ch st made, sc in next sc *; repeat from * to * 4 times, ch 6, 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook, 1 PS in sc just made, ch 5; sl st in first sc to join.

19 rnd: ch 1, [1 sc, 1 PS] in same sc, sc in next sc, (ch 6, [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc) 2 times, * ch 18, 1 PS, sc in next sc *; repeat from * to * 4 times; ch 6, [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc, ch 6, sl st in first sc to join.

20 rnd: ch 1, [1 sc, 1 PS] in same sc, sc in next sc, (ch 7, [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc) 2 times, * ch 8, 1 sc around ch arcs from rnds 17-19, ch 9, 1 PS in last ch st made, sc in next sc *; repeat from * to * 4 times; ch 7, [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc, ch 7; sl st in first sc to join.

21 rnd: ch 1, [1 sc, 1 PS] in same sc, 1 sc in next sc, (ch 8, [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc) 2 times, * ch 9, 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook, 1 PS in sc just made, ch 9, 1 PS, 1 sc in next sc *; repeat from * to * 4 times; ch 8, [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc, ch 8; sl st in first sc to join.

22-29 rnd: ch 1, [1 sc, 1 PS] in same sc, 1 sc in next sc, (8 cat, [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc) 2 times * ch 9, [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc, ch 10, 1 PS, 1 sc in next sc *; repeat from * to * 4 times; ch 8, [1 sc, 1 PS] in next sc, ch 8; sl st in first sc to join.

Border

1 sc in each ch st, [1 sc, 1 PS] in each sc preceding a PS, join round with a sl st in the first sc.

Finishing

Break yarn, weave in ends. Wash Esoscheletro according to the ball band instructions and let it dry on a flat surface. Steam the project without touching it to give more volume to puff stitches (optional).
